If you don't have a microphone, then just raise your arm a bit, people will then give you their attention.

Bring the microphone to you, do not bend over into it. Bring your notes to you, don't bend over into them. Of course, you can always raise your phone and look at Aunt Lisa, that will certainly get her attention!

Speak slowly but with enthusiasm. Speak as if you were out to dinner with four or five friends and having a conversation, because you are, except a larger group.

Make eye contact as you speak, especially to Jack and Samantha.

As we discussed, practice your speech three times. Practice it twice, a day or two before the reception, and then the day of the reception. Try and do all three by yourself. Listeners mean well, but they can be distracting. As you practice be aware of your voice inflections and emphasis, especially when you transition from humorous to serious.

You will do just fine, this is a celebration and your audience wants you to have fun along with them.

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## Begin:
