As a child when she was a stay at home mom, she planted and sold vegetables every weekend at the market. On weekends she cooked food to sell and made a decent profit doing it. When we came to the U.S from Guyana, she obtained a CNA certificate and began working outside the home. Mom worked long hours and sometimes even worked two jobs at a time to take care of the seven of us. My mom does not have a GED or college degree but through hard work, she was able to purchase and own two homes. Although she wanted to complete school and have a career, she was never able to do so because she made the sacrifice to put her children first and made sure our needs were met. She is talented and creative. As children, she sowed just about everything for us. Mom sowed our uniforms, designed dresses for us for special occasions such as Easter, graduation, proms and a favorite of mine, my sister Carla's wedding dress. To me that was so special. Mom later went to design school which she completed but again never pursued a career in the fashion field because her kids still needed her although we were a lot older. Throughout our lives she continually sacrificed her goals and dreams because she felt that our needs came before hers. As we got older and she realized that we didn't need her as much, she began to find other things to do such as traveling. My mother never wanted to go anywhere but Guyana. Mommy's idea of traveling was going to Guyana to spend two weeks, return and complain about the people back home. Her first real vacation was in 2004 when myself, Carla, Yolanda and Paul went to St. Thomas for carnival and I dragged her with us. We also took her to Nieves, and Tortola as we went island hopping. She complained and protested because those places were nothing like her Guyana. "These places are nothing like Guyana" she would say. What she really meant was that she was bored because she didn't have to cook and didn't have anyone to argue with which was her usual routine when she went to Guyana. What I realized then was that my mother didn't know how to just relax and live in the moment. Mom thought that when you go on vacation you still had to cook and clean and argue and stress. But after a few trips she eventually got it. She has come a long way; she doesn't just go to Guyana she will go anywhere if she gets an invite. She has been to London tree times and has been to a few islands in the Caribbean. She especially likes cruising and she feels that we should send her on a cruise at least twice a year.
- 6. Please share information about events or memories you have together that you would like mentioned in the speech. My mother and father were married and together for about 30 years. My father passed away 25 years ago. He was sick for a few years and couldn't work so my mother worked and took care of the family. Before his final days while he was in in hospital my mother found out that he had deceived and she was hurt. Despite the pain and embarrassment, he caused, she overlooked it and continued to love and cared for him until his passing. When I look back at that period of time and I realize how incredible my mother is and that she was

- teaching us a lesson in forgiveness. She was by my father's side everyday even though she worked 7 days a week and she worked 12hr shifts. I don't think that I can be as strong as my mother is and I truly admire her.

I would like to audience feel how much our mother is loved by her children and grandchildren and how much we appreciate all the sacrifices she has made for us. I want them to know that she is an amazing mother and grandmother and we all love, adore and respect her a great deal.
