9.) Do you want the speech to be an incentive for your audience to do anything? **Yes, I want them to call, write, and contact their members of congress and their military leaders to correct this injustice in the service men not being able to obtain proper chiropractic care.**

Are there any thoughts, feelings, emotions, that you would like your audience to experience after the speech/address/presentation? **I want them to know how proud the chiropractic profession is to be able to do our small part in helping our patriots get benefits and we as a profession will continue to support these brave men and women who serve.**

FINALLY: Please tell us any additional anecdotes, personalities, statistics, that may add to the depth of the speech/presentation? the chiropractic profession was under attack by the American Medical Association: (see Wilk vs AMA litigation), where in 1963 the American Medical Association (AMA) formed a committee on quackery to "contain and eliminate" the profession of chiropractic. After a 17 year legal battle, the courts ruled in favor of the chiropractic plaintiffs and declared that the "lingering effects of the AMA conspiracy to contain and eliminate the chiropractic profession would linger for decades". The AMA did despicable acts to prevent chiropractic colleges from being accredited, prevent chiropractic from being included in Medicare and other governmental programs, tried to stop chiropractic from being included in benefit plans, and to this day the military has not fully complied with congressional legislation to open up the inclusion of chiropractic. There are chiropractors (DC's) doctors of chiropractic in the VA and DoD but not to the extent that the injuries of war.....have on the musculo skeletal system for our service men. The toll on their bodies which chiropractic can be immeasurably beneficial has been hampered, and the benefits of non-drug, non-surgical care from chiropractic can and will reduce the opioid crisis currently experienced by our vets. They are hooked on opioids usually from an initial back pain or musculo skeletal injury and denied chiropractic services.
